A Secure Relocation for an Intelligence Agency

A U.S. government intelligence agency needed to relocate a secure data center that stored critical, confidential information. The task required extreme precision, full compliance with federal security standards, and a flawless execution. The stakes were high. CHALLENGES

Each server rack weighed over 2,000 pounds and stood taller than a standard doorway. Since the servers had to remain installed during transport, the move became even more complex.
